ELI Selected to Head International Enforcement Network

ELI was selected to serve as **Secretariat of the International Network for Environmental Compliance and Enforcement**—a network of 2,000 practitioners in 150 countries, including environmental regulators, investigators, prosecutors, judges, and employees of international organizations. ELI will convene INECE members and stakeholders, advise the network on environmental governance activities, and provide strategic thinking to guide engagement. ELI will pursue opportunities to continue the productive dialogue with the Chinese government on how to best ensure environmental compliance.



ELI Builds Ties to China to Improve Environmental Quality

Reflecting upon his long-standing leadership in the private and public sector and his ground-breaking work to forge U.S.-China engagement, **U.S. Treasury Secretary Henry Paulson** and **honoree of the ELI Environmental Achievement Award** at the 2016 ELI Annual Award Dinner aptly noted, *"When you think about almost any major issue, whether it's driving global growth, all of the environmental problems, keeping the world peace, denuclearization, they're all easier if we're working with China, more difficult if we're working at cross purposes."* ELI is enhancing the capacity of government, corporations, and nonprofit organizations to build environmental rule of law in China.

ELI Plays Key Role in Creation of New Environmental Global Judicial Institute

At the World Congress on Environmental Law in Rio de Janeiro in April 2016, ELI President Scott Fulton joined a small gathering of current and former judges and legal experts to create a new **Global Judicial Institute for the Environment** to build capacity within the judiciary around the world for environmental adjudication. This Institute will expand and leverage ELI's groundbreaking work on judicial training, which began in 1990.

ELI Helps Countries Enact Laws to Meet Their Paris Commitments

ELI drafted a **model framework for a national-level climate change law** to support the progress of countries serious about meeting their Paris Agreement goals. ELI's model law is a valued resource for countries seeking to implement domestic legislation giving effect to their Nationally Determined Contributions.

Protecting Forever Vulnerable Ocean Fisheries and Resources

More than 450 individuals representing government officials, nonprofit groups, and others from over 90 countries attended the 2016 Our Ocean Conference last September, hosted by the U.S. Department of State in Washington, DC. At the conference, nearly 20 countries announced the creation of new Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) or the expansion of existing ones. These “ocean parks” are areas set aside to ensure that endangered fisheries are protected.

There, ELI presented its new report, *Legal Tools for Strengthening Marine Protected Area Enforcement: A Handbook*. The report provides guidance to countries seeking to improve enforcement of their existing MPAs or to create new ones. It offers a variety of legal tools and approaches (including sample legal provisions) that countries may use to implement reforms through targeted domestic legislation, international agreements, or other instruments.

ELI Honors the History of Environmental Law

On Earth Day 2016, ELI released “**Pioneers in Environmental Law**,” an oral history project of 24 individuals without whom environmental law in the United States might never have become a reality. It was these individuals who, in the 1960s and 1970s, had the foresight, commitment, and determination to call for federal laws to be passed and environmental agencies to be created. 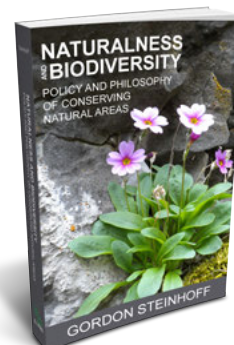
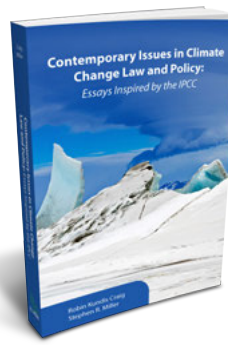
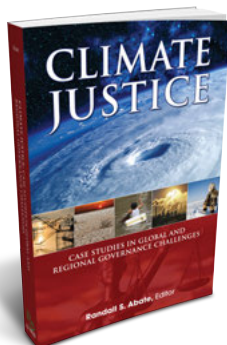
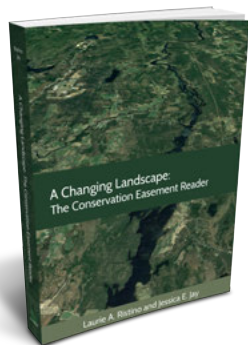
ELI Helps Enhance Community Climate Resilience
