

Jason Rylander is a senior staff attorney for Defenders of Wildlife, where he litigates endangered species and habitat conservation cases in federal court and represents Defenders in coalitions, advisory committees, and on Capitol Hill.

Before joining Defenders of Wildlife in 2005, Jason served as Litigation & Policy Counsel for Community Rights Counsel and was an associate at the law firm of Perkins Coie, LLP. Prior to attending law school, he held environmental positions with The Conservation Fund and the National Wildlife Federation. He is the former managing editor of the *Land Letter*, a national newsletter covering natural resource policy.

Jason earned a B.A. in Government, *cum laude*, from Cornell University and a J.D. from the William & Mary School of Law, where he served as an editor of both the *William & Mary Law Review* and the *Environmental Law and Policy Review*.
