




Snapshot: Women in Water Diplomacy Network

- Central Asia-Afghanistan Network launched in 2021
- Global Strategy 'A Path Forward for Women, Water, Peace and Security' released in 2022
- North America Network launched in 2023
- South Caucasus Network launched in 2024
- New basin Networks under development Southern Africa, Latin America

Water Confidence Building Measures (CBMs)

- Environmental peacebuilding is the 'process of governing and managing natural resources and the environment to support durable peace' (<u>Bruch et al, 2012</u>)
- Positive environmental cooperation on an issue may foster confidence-building between parties in inter-state and intra-state conflicts - entry point for dialogue
- Stimson Center, CBMs are 'diverse...tools, such as hot lines, people-to-people exchange, prior notification of exercises and cross-border economic projects that can help defuse tension, resolve misunderstanding, and promote cooperation...' (1999)
- CBMs mutual incentives and benefits, inclusivity, intergroup or interstate communication, trust-building, de-escalation and peacebuilding tool
- Water-related CBMs e.g. Georgia, Central Asia, etc
